OHS and risk management auditing

definition

The OHS and Injury Management system audit highlights compliance and deficiencies within company systems to assist in the development of action plans for improvement. Selection of the appropriate audit tool is determined in consultation with all parties.

purpose

Conducting assessments encourages workplaces to adopt and implement a range of effective OHS and Injury Management actions in a systematic manner to meet to legislative compliance, reduce workplace injury/illness and minimise costs associated with workplace incidents.

features

CGU Safety and Risk Services use their own trademarked assessment tool to focus on key OHS and Injury Management issues. Auditing against Australian Standards, SafetyMap or WorkSafe WA Plan Assessment is also available.

The typical scope of an audit includes, but is not limited to:

- OHS responsibility and compliance.
- Consultation and communication.
- Risk and hazard management.
- Record and document management.
- Injury management.
- System evaluation and review.

outcome

The audit will highlight the strengths and weaknesses of any existing OHS and Injury Management systems and provides recommendations for improvement. Prioritisation of recommendations allows for allocation of responsibilities and resources, to address high risk areas in reasonably practicable time frames.



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
